I. Introduce the Topic

Tell students that they will be learning about ancient Greece. Explain that they will first watch a video about ancient Greece. They will also preview vocabulary before they read the TrueFlix flipbook Ancient Greece.

Watch the Video

Show the video Ancient Greece. When finished, ask students to tell in their own words what the video was about. Discuss with students what they already know about ancient Greece. Then have students tell what more they would like irn.



Tell students that they will be learning about ancient Greece. Explain that they will first watch a video about ancient Greece. They will also preview vocabulary before they read the TrueFlix flipbook *Ancient Greece*.

Watch the Video

Show the video Ancient Greece. When finished, ask students to tell in their own words what the video was about. Discuss with students what they already know about ancient Greece. Then have students tell what more they would like to learn.

GETTING AROUND

Home and Browse

The TrueFlix Home screen offers two browse options: a category browse and a thumbnail browse.

The category browse utilizes the two groups of TrueFlix titles on the left and right of the screen: People, Places, and History to the left and Science and Nature to the right. Below these titles are nine and twelve tabs, respectively, which correspond to each of these two groups' categories. For People, Places, and History, the categories are American Indians, Ancient Civilizations, Biographies, The Civil War, Continents, The Thirteen Colonies, U.S. Government, U.S. Regions, and Westward Expansion. For Science and Nature, the categories are Animal Kingdom, Disasters, Earth Science, Ecosystems, Experiments, Extreme Nature, Extreme Science, Health, Human Body, Outer Space, Physical Science, and The Solar System. Clicking on one of the 21 categories accesses a category browse screen from which you can choose among thumbnails for all the TrueFlix units in that category. Clicking on any of these thumbnails brings you directly to the title screen for that unit.



BookFlix is an excellent interactive program for parents to experience with their children. Parents and caregivers can bring their 4- to 8-year-old children to the library to spend some time exploring the program together. Or you can access the program at home through your library's remote access system. Older brothers and sisters may also enjoy helping their younger siblings navigate the topics and stories in *BookFlix*.

All the fiction/nonfiction pairs in *BookFlix* are categorized according to nine themes: Animals and Nature, Earth and Sky, Family and Community, People and Places, Music and Rhyme, ABC's and 1, 2, 3's, Adventure, Imagination, and Celebrations. Each topic includes a pair of books, one fiction and one nonfiction.


With topics and stories appropriate for the learning skills of preschoolers through grade three, *BookFlix* makes learning fun and interesting, as children learn the difference between fact and fiction.

Browse the categories and choose a topic that interests your child. Review the lesson plan that accompanies each pair to help start a dialogue with your child before viewing the video. After going to the Pair page, click on Watch the Story. Enjoy the story as it unfolds in the video. (If your child likes the story you may want to check out the book the next time you visit the library.) Click on Meet the Author. What can you learn about authors' lives to help you understand the stories they write? If your child is interested, click on the link to visit the author's Web site. You may also explore some reference books the next time you visit the library. Reference volumes such as the *Junior Book of Authors and Illustrators* series or the *Something About the Author* series will give you more information about your favorite authors and illustrators.






